#### The Women of Five Wars

The limited but important roles women played in Korea and Vietnam paved the path to more expanded -- and in some cases more dangerous -specialties in recent wars. In the fifteen years between the end of the Vietnam War and the start of Operation Desert Shield, the armed forces of the U.S. opened up many specialties to women. The nature of the conflicts in Iraq and Afghanistan, with blurred lines of engagement, have placed more servicewomen in harm's way. With greater responsibilities have come increased risk of injury and the after-effects of armed engagements with an elusive and persistent enemy.
